## Karst Interest Group (KIG) Mission

The KIG's mission is to encourage and support inter-disciplinary collaboration and technology transfer among USGS scientists working in karst areas. Additionally, the KIG encourages cooperative studies between the Water Mission Area, the Water Science Centers, and other USGS Programs and Mission Area Centers, and between USGS and other Federal agencies, State and local agencies and university researchers.

## Purpose of KIG Workshop

The purpose of the workshop is to bring together scientists from various offices of the USGS, Department of the Interior, other Federal and state agencies, research institutes, and universities to present the results of scientific work related to karst and discuss karst related programs in their bureaus or offices. In addition, the workshop establishes a network of karst researchers and helps to build collaborative research projects.
